Match Roundup from 4 January 2025

With many games from adjoining leagues being postponed due to frozen pitches we are pleased to say that all seven of the scheduled DPL games went ahead. Only Whitehill and Borden v Bournemouth Sports in the Hampshire Saturday Cup was postponed due to a frozen pitch.

Dorchester Sports returned to the top of the league with a 4-2 win against Sherborne Town Reserves. A ten goal thriller at Bridport resulted in a 5-5 draw for Bridport FC Reserves against Portland United Reserves. Another draw saw hosts Cobham result in a 3-3 draw against visitors Westland Sports.

Wimborne Town Reserves gained a valuable three points in their 3-1 home win against Hamworthy Utd Reserves to move them off the bottom of the table. Hamworthy Recreation Reserves had a very entertaining game to come out 2-1 winners at home to visitors Swanage Town & Herston FC.

Two home losses were Balti who lost 1-2 against Poole Borough and Bournemouth Electric 1-2 against visitors Holt.

Cobham Sports unbeaten run continued at Merley Park on Saturday but they couldn't take the three points that were on offer due to the resilience of Westland Sports who, three times in the game led but they in turn couldn't hold on to their lead as Cobham hit back. The visitors from Somerset took the lead in the third minute through Jamie Green, in the 45th minute when Dan Baggs bundled the ball and the keeper over the line and the 72nd minute when Phil Ormrod struck on the counter, equalisers came from Marco Fowler, Mike Trim and Charlie Harries, his first goal for the club as the game finished a three apiece, a fair result in the end.



Westland got off to a flier when they scored in the third minute after a Dan Baggs long throw wasn't dealt with well enough and Jamie Green struck from outside the box, the ball hitting the net via the far post. Josh Buck brought a good save out of Harrison Wallis in the Westland goal in the 13th minute after being played in by Dan Brown but back came Westland in the 19th minute, Harvey Wroe going close and from the resulting corner Green couldn't capitalise at the far post as the ball evaded everyone. Cobham began to get some dominance and they were back on terms in the 30th minute, Case was found out wide on the left, he took his man on and crossed and Fowler was on hand at the far post with an accomplished finish. Cobham were on top but the Westland counter was always a real threat, Phil and Steve Ormrod pressing well and disrupting any fluency from Cobham. Cobham went behind again in the 45th minute, a corner from the left was only partially cleared and Baggs bundled the man and ball over the line, the referee allowed the goal to stand after consultation with his assistant. With the game in added on time Cobham hit straight back, lovely play between Buck and Callum Perry saw the latter cross and Trim was at the far post to stroke the ball home from 10 yards and the sides went to the break all square at 2-2.

Cobham started the second half well having plenty of the ball but were finding Westland difficult to break down and at times, their final ball would let them down. Against the run of play in the 72nd minute the visitors hit the front again, Cobham caught with numbers pushing forward gave the ball away and were countered when Foster was found in space down the left, he took the ball in his stride and breached the Cobham rearguard and struck a crisp left footed drive across the hapless Deakin in the Cobham goal and the ball nestled into the far corner, 3-2 Westland. Back came Cobham again just four minutes later, Fowler was in room down the right, beat his man and squared the ball to the six yard box and Charlie Harries was on hand to head home and level things up 3-3. Westland went close in the 79th minute again on the counter, Foster's shot just wide of the far post, back came Cobham and Harries had a strike from 15 yards after being played in by Jimmy Fry well saved by Wallis and the frenetic end to this game saw it finish as an honourable draw on the day.

Westland pushed the home side all the way with their impressive press but couldn't hold on to any of their leads, Cobham weren't at their best but managed a draw through some real character and endeavour, difficult to pick any one man for Cobham on the day but Mike Trim in midfield would steal it for me through sheer work rate and encouragement.

Hamworthy Recreation Reserves aimed to turn around their recent run and managed to grind out a 2-1 win against an inform Swanage Town & Herston at the BJM Stadium.

Hamworthy got off to an uncharacteristic slow start, couldn't string any passes together and this allowed Swanage a lot of possession in turn overs due to poor passing. Swanage had numerous shots at the Hamworthy goal only for Henry Birtwistle to be on hand to keep them out, he could only hold out until the 18th minute when the visitors took the lead. A poor clearance found 2 Swanage players on the edge of the penalty area, a cross/shot found Albie Turner in the middle of the penalty area, he swivelled and shot into the bottom corner, 0-1. This, as in previous weeks, spurred Ham Rec on and they got the bit between their teeth started to assert themselves on the game, building up a couple of chance on goal they were awarded a freekick in the 26th minute on the edge of the Swanage penalty area, Elliot Birtwistle delivered a freekick right on top of the goalkeeper, the ball rebounded off the cross bar and fell to Bryce Banfield who was following up to draw the score level, 1-1.

The second half started on a more level platform, both sides building up attacks, Swanage had more of the goal bound efforts only for Henry Birtwistle to keep the home side in the game. Rec made some changes to freshen up the attack and within minutes of coming on Matt Kerse had a great chance to give the home side the lead, Liam Cructchley spotted the run of Bryce Banfield, he out stripped the Swanage defender, squared the ball to Matt who put his shot narrowly wide. On the 76th minute the home side managed to convert one of their chance, Elliot Birtwistle played a first time pass to Bryce Banfield, he spotted the run of Archie Whitfield on the left wing, Archie chased down the Swanage defender who's failed clearance gifted Archie the opportunity to round the Swanage goalkeeper who had

come out to collect the ball and roll the ball into the open net, 2-1. Both sides attempted to push for more goals but as the time ticked away, Ham Rec controlled the tempo and saw the game out for a much needed win.

The Bees had to reshuffle their squad several times due to illness and were slow to start. Portlands Sanchez Baker outpaced the backline and rounded Kershaw before converting from close range. Bridport were level when a Gareth Will corner was flicked on by Harry Boulton before deflecting off a Portland player. Parity was short lived and Sanchez Baker again beat the defence to score his second 12 minutes into the game. His hat trick was complete when converting from the spot on 20 minutes after being brought down by keeper Kershaw. Kershaw then denied a Portland fourth from close range. Shortly after Sanchez Baker was given a yellow for raising his hands which saw Josh Baker sin binned for Bridport. This seemed to kick-start the Bees and after good play in the midfield Harry Boulton confidently finished when one on one with the

Portland keeper. Jack Summers was denied an equaliser by the crossbar but the game was level on 38 when Stan Woodhouse scored the goal of the game - a quick counter found Woodhouse wide on the right, he cut inside and curled a left foot shot into the top corner from 25 yards.

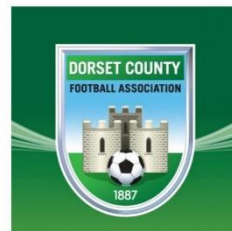

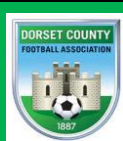

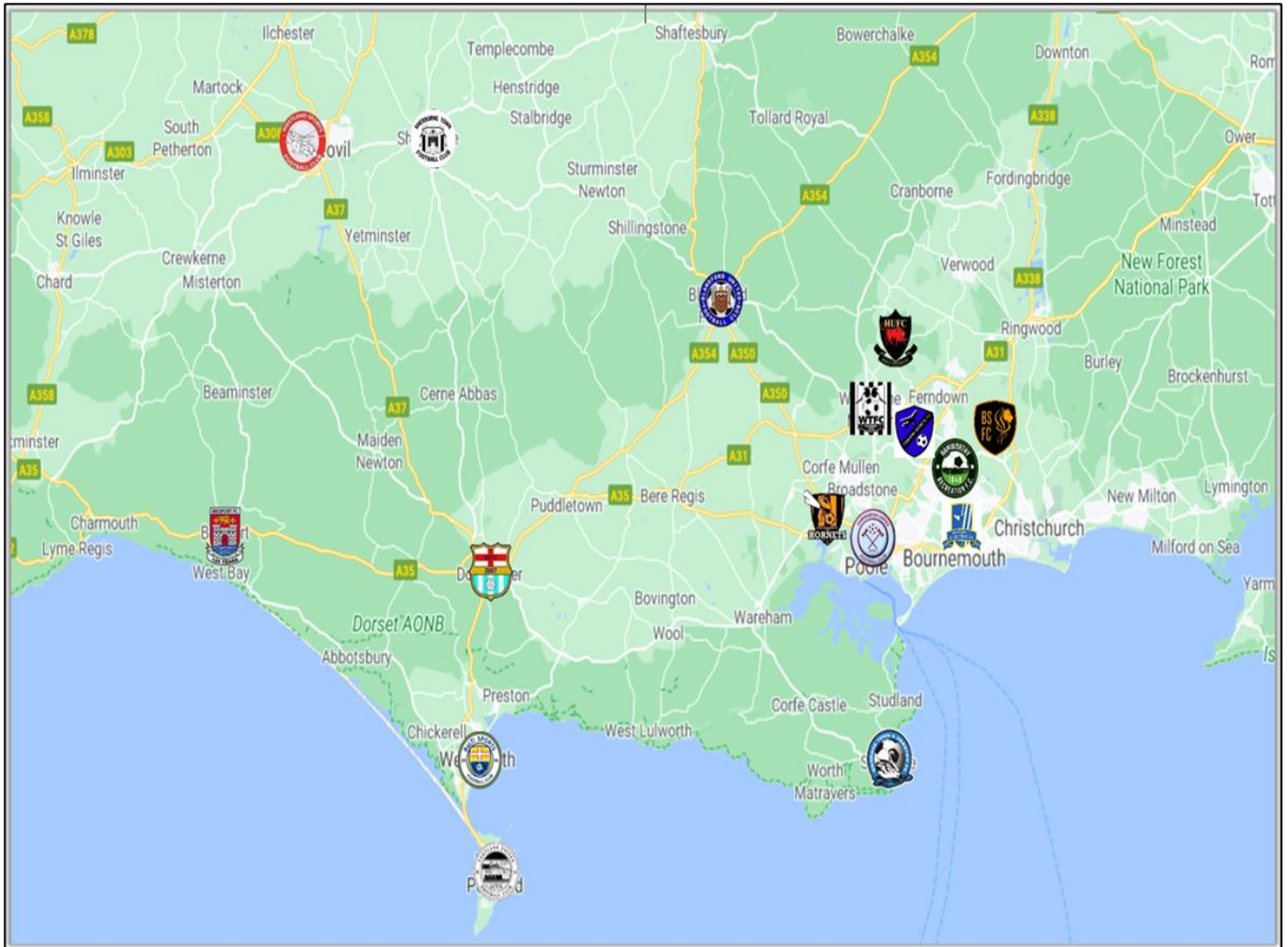
