Swanage produced a brilliant performance to defeat high flying Westland Sports 3-0 in the Dorset Premier Football League at Day's Park. This game had it ALL including 11 Yellows and 1 Red card.



The match began evenly, with both teams testing each other in the early exchanges. Swans had the first real chance in the 7th minute when Will Spetch's header from a corner created a half-chance, but the follow-up shot drifted wide. This was an early sign of what was to come, as Spetch's dominance in the air in both boxes proved crucial throughout the game. Westlands responded quickly in the 8th minute, with a looping header that narrowly sailed over the bar. In the 11th minute, Malik Kamal came close for Westlands with a powerful shot from distance that flew inches over the crossbar, leaving Swans' goalkeeper Brad Smith rooted to the spot. Westlands looked dangerous in spells, but it was the Swans who broke the deadlock. The breakthrough came in the 28th minute when Will Spetch's header from an Ocean Smith corner was tipped over by the Westlands keeper. From the resulting corner, a penalty was awarded for hand ball in the box, and **SAM CLARKE** stepped up to calmly slot the ball home, putting Swans 1-0 up. Swanage grew in confidence after the goal, however, goal scorer Clarke needed to make a crucial challenge on the edge of the box in the 40th minute to preserve their lead.

HT 1-0

Swanage started the second half brightly, dominating possession and pinning Westlands back in the opening five minutes. Their pressure paid off in the 55th minute when Ocean Smith whipped in a free kick, and **WILL SPETCH** rose at the back post to head in Swans second goal. Swans continued to grow stronger, and in the 72nd minute,

Cody Moore had a golden opportunity to extend the lead when he was through on goal, but the Westlands goalkeeper made a brave save at his feet. Westlands had a rare moment of threat in the 75th minute when Josh Payne’s fierce strike was expertly tipped around the post by Brad Smith. However, Swanage soon sealed the result. In the 78th minute, another Ocean Smith free kick found an unmarked **WILL SPETCH**, who volleyed home from 10 yards, leaving the keeper with no chance and securing his second goal of the game. Westlands’ frustration boiled over, culminating in Malik Kamal being sent off in the 87th minute for a second yellow card after pushing an opponent. Swanage managed the closing minutes well, running down the clock and comfortably seeing out the game. Westlands failed to mount any serious threat in the second half, and Swans’ defensive solidity ensured a 3-0 victory, with all three goals coming from set pieces. While the game was closely contested, Swans aerial threat and dominance from set pieces proved to be the decisive factors. Both teams struggled to break each other down in open play, but Swans capitalized on their dead-ball opportunities, converting all three of their goals from set pieces. This tactical advantage ultimately separated the two sides, allowing Swanage to secure a well-earned victory in a match where chances in open play were few and far between.

This was always anticipated to be a close hard-fought game and so it proved. From the start Dorchester Sports pushed hard and while not producing many clear-cut opportunities looked the most likely to break the deadlock. Electric gradually increased their involvement in the game and Jackson Kavita was unlucky with his shot in the 32nd minute which was struck firmly straight at the Dorchester keeper. The strong backlines of both teams controlled much of the play and half time was reached without many chances with the score still level.

The second half saw the game increasingly open up and both sides tried to attack down the wings to avoid the centre-half's dominating the through balls. The game remained fairly even with half chances at either end. The key moment came in the 80th minute when the winger for Electric, Jackson Kavita, dribbled the ball into the Dorchester area and was fouled by the Dorchester defender which resulted in a penalty for Electric. This was well put away by their Striker and Captain **SCOTT JOYCE**. Injuries and tiredness affected both teams and a number of players needed treatment, and substitutes were needed. Dorchester pushed players forward and Electric put up a solid rearguard action and with some solid defensive play, and a little luck, Electric saw the second half to a conclusion managing to hold onto their lead.

Cobham started really brightly but they were caught on the counterattack in the 8th minute with Mark Ford bringing out a good save from Jacob Deakin but after an even start

Blandford hit the front with 11 minutes on the clock, Reuben Stanley was put in down the right flank and he was too strong for Andrei Munteanu and his firm cross was prodded home by **ELLIOTT MANSON**. Cobham continued to take the game to Blandford and Dan Naish brought out a fingertip save from Harry Foden with a speculative effort in the 25th minute and just a minute later that man Foden foiled them again when Josh Toop's clever footwork deceived Lloyd Cole and his clever effort was pushed out for a corner. Blandford increased their lead with 36 minutes on the clock, Cobham conceded a corner and **MARK FORD** scored direct from the kick with the ball sailing into the far corner of the net giving the Royals a two-goal advantage at the break.

HT 2-0

The pivotal goal of the game came just 20 seconds after the break, Stanley showing the Cobham defence a clean pair of heals down the right and his crisp cross was met by the advancing **GEORGE COLEMAN** who made no mistake from close range. 3-0 down and a mountain to climb for Cobham as they went to the bench early in the hole that fresh legs would get them back in the game but Blandford were having their best spell of the game as it opened up and Stanley brought a good save out of Deakin in the 61st minute and they increased their lead just a minute later, Fowler lost possession and Stanley got the better of Munteanu and his cross was met by **GEORGE COLEMAN** to put the Royals four up. The game was end to end now but Blandford always looked the more dangerous and when **GEORGE COLEMAN** was put through down the left by Stanley he coolly slotted the ball home into the far corner giving Deakin no chance to make it 5-0. Cobham scored a consolation goal in the 84th minute, Fowler doing well taking the ball to the line and his firm cross was put into his own net by Jack Hughes, 5-1. Cobham thought they had scored again just a minute later when Seb Stout's fine header appeared to cross the line, but the linesman didn't agree, and the ball was cleared to safety and the game finished up as a resounding 5-1 win for the Royals.

Rec started the brighter and after just 3 minutes a charge down in the Blues box, after some good offensive pressure, resulted in a shot from Curtis Lane that was blocked and cleared. The home side continued to apply the pressure with some fine passing football. On the left flank Matt Kearse and Liam Crutchley combined well, the ball played in behind for Charlie Harries to set back to Ash Boyt, whose shot sailed over the bar. With

just 12 minutes on the clock Harries curled one that the keeper could only watch as it hit the top of the right-hand post, with the resulting rebound cleared. After 21 minutes Penalty! **CHARLIE HARRIES** beat his man and was taken down, he got up to convert to the keepers right; 1-0. With 23 minutes on the clock, a **CURTIS LANE** finish from great one touch football between Kearse and Harries saw the hosts double their lead: 2-0. Rec continued to play neat passing football from the back but no further goals before half time.

Bridport's Brad Rowe was dismissed for his second yellow with 15 to go and Hamworthy were clinical when miscommunication on the left flank was punished by the visitors **JACOB CROWTHER** to seal the 3 points. Hamworthy will be delighted with their victory. Their young side broke with pace, won most second balls in the first half and were up for the contest.

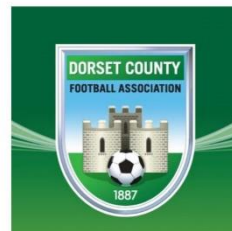


This game was a cagey affair with lots of effort but, especially, in the 1st half, very few clear cut chances as both sides struggled to take control of the game with defences coming out on top

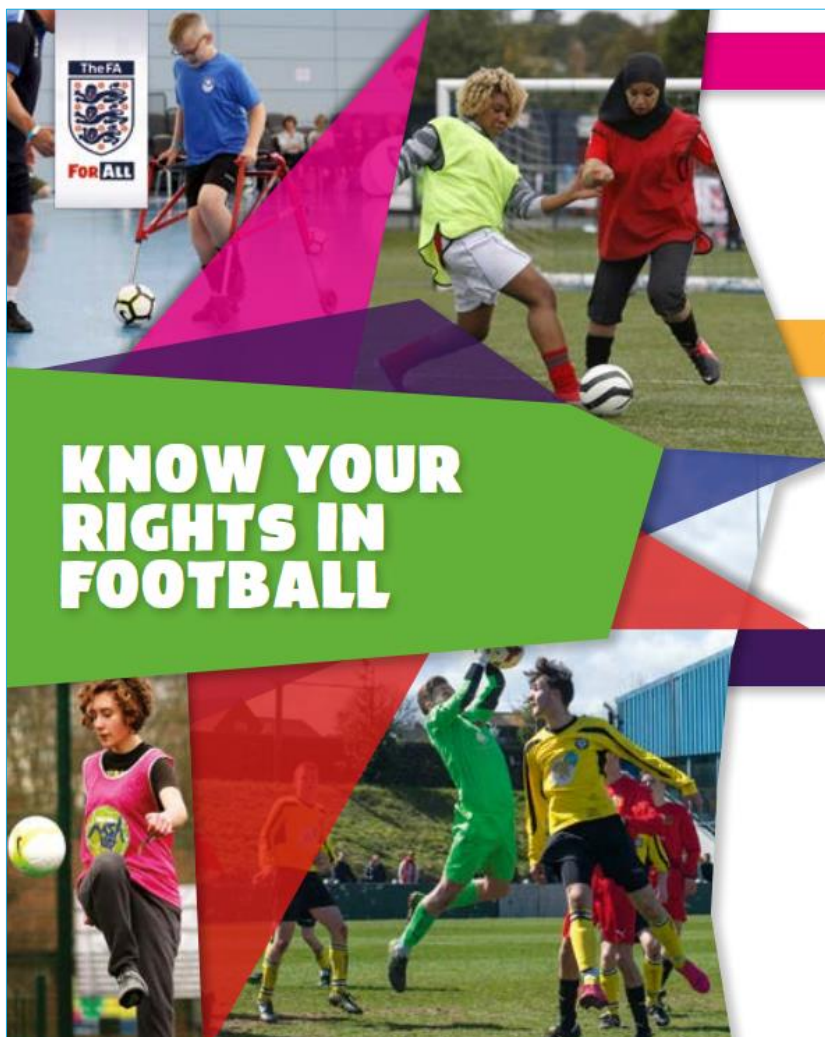

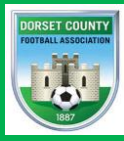

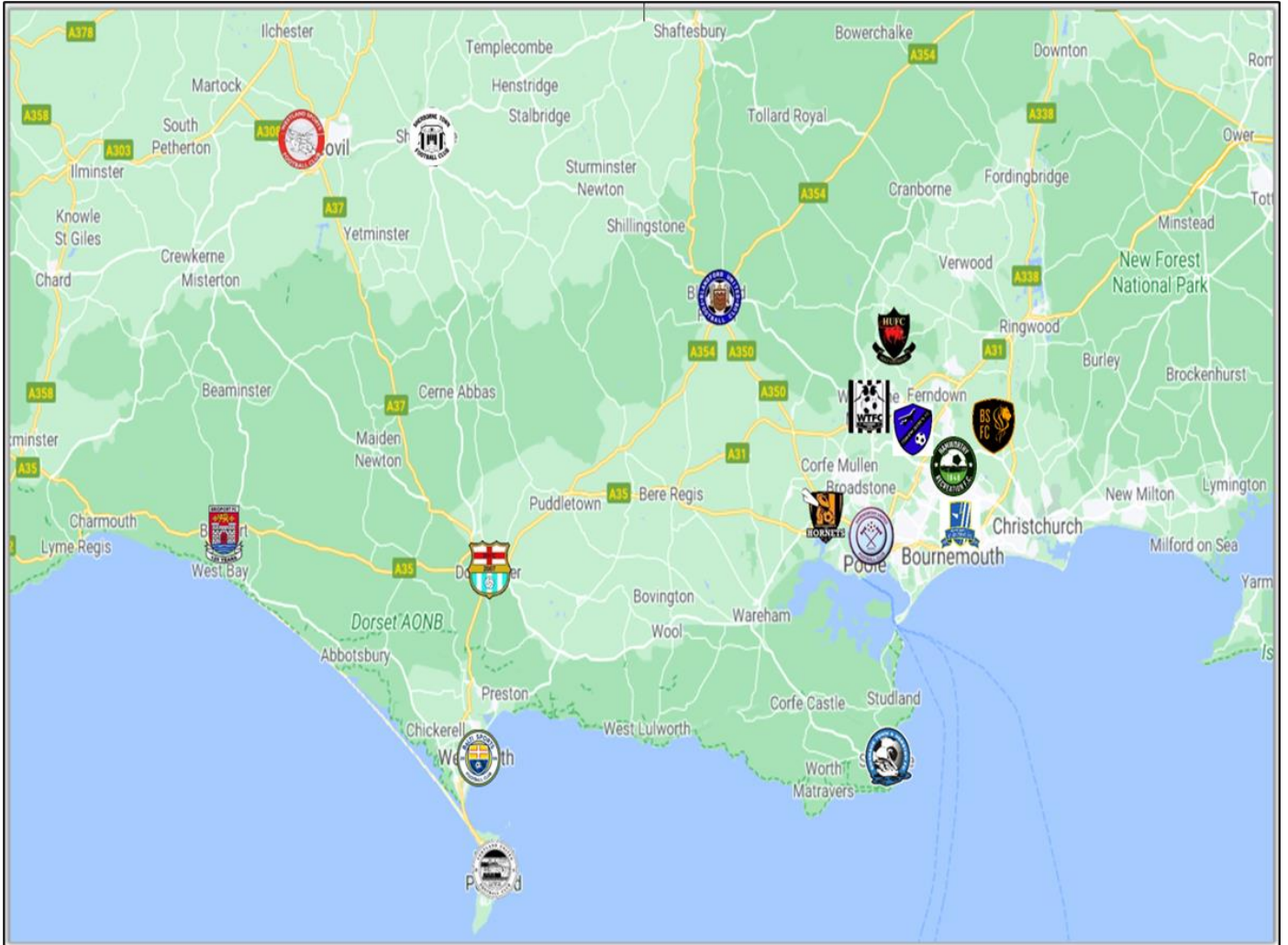
